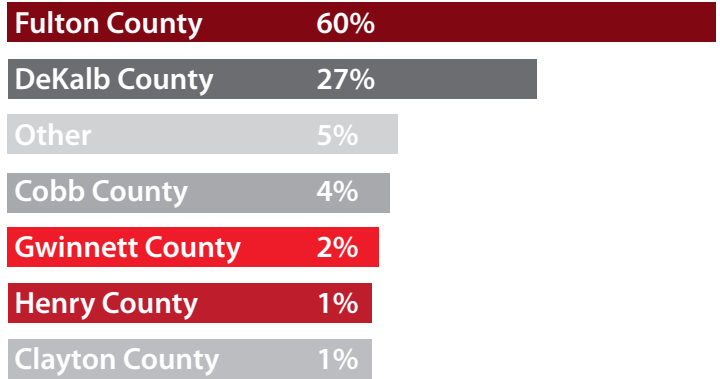

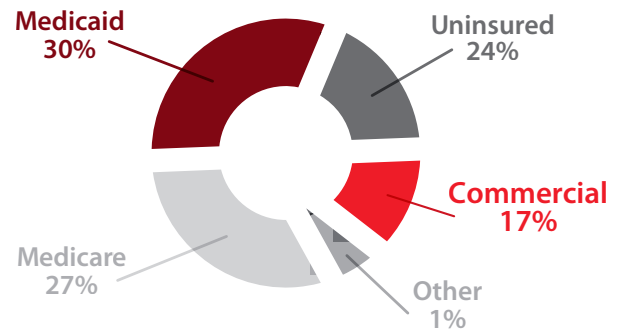

- 1941** State General Assembly approves the Fulton-DeKalb Hospital Authority to operate the hospital
- 1923** Steiner Clinic, Georgia's first and largest comprehensive Cancer Center, is established
- 1917** Municipal Training School for colored nurses opens
- 1915** Grady and Emory School of Medicine partnership begins
- 1898** School for Nurses opens
- 1892** Grady Hospital – owned and operated by the city of Atlanta - opens with 100 beds
